Leymah Roberta Gbowee led a women's nonviolent peace movement that helped bring an end to the Second Liberian Civil War in 2003. **Ellen Johnson Sirleaf** was president of Liberia from 2006 to 2018 and was the first woman elected to serve as a head of state in Africa. Sirleaf and Gbowee received the 2011 [Nobel Peace Prize](#) "for their non-violent struggle for the safety of women and for women's rights to full participation in peace-building work."
